Established at Ahmedabad in 1961, the National Institute of Design (NID) offers multidisciplinary design education. The institute functions as an autonomous body under the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT), Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Government of India and has been declared an Institute of National Importance by virtue of the National Institute of Design Act, 2014 (No.18 of 2014) which has come into effect from September 16, 2014.

NID has attained national and international repute owing to its experience in the fields of design education, research, application of advanced teaching methodologies, and unparalleled design research projects all of which span more than six decades. It has been recognised as a Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (SIRO) by the Department of Science & Technology, Government of India. NID is also a member of the Association of Indian Universities (AIU).

Beginning as a single-campus institute, NID has now grown into a multicampus institute with a national and international profile. Presently, NID has two extension campuses—one each at Gandhinagar and Bengaluru which were established in the early 2000s.

From an institute mainly providing undergraduate programmes, NID has become one of the pioneering design institutes in the world with Bachelor's (B.Des.) and Master's (M.Des.) programmes across 5 broad faculty streams and 20 diverse design disciplines. In pursuit of its continued commitment to design research, NID started a Doctoral Programme in Design which gives impetus to design research priorities for its current faculty in collaboration with researchers who are selected as Ph.D. scholars under faculty supervision.

The institute has state-of-the-art infrastructural facilities such as the Skill Development Labs, Knowledge Management Centre (KMC), Information Technology (IT) Centre, and Design Vision Centre to name a few. These have helped NID establish its leadership and pre-eminence among various design institutions.

NID continues to be an aspirational 'Institutional Global Brand' for the youth and this is manifested in the increasing demand to secure admission at NID.



The number of students graduating from the institute each year has increased substantially; it has increased from 35 in 2000 to over 300 in 2020.

NID has also signed collaborative agreements with 100 premier design institutes across the world, facilitating increased international exposure for students and faculty. The institute's efforts towards becoming an effective medium for design promotion continue to draw strength from partnerships with other global organisations such as Cumulus, World Design Organisation (formerly ICSID), and GALA Consortium to name a few.

NID has been playing a significant role in promoting design through various first-time initiatives. It has been instrumental in initiating the CII-NID Design Summit and the Businessworld-NID Design Excellence Award with an aim to move towards a 'Design-enabled India'.

NID's efforts towards making a National Design Policy finally materialised in February 2007 when the then Central Government announced the National Design Policy (NDP), the first among developing countries. In pursuance of the NDP, and with the initial handholding of NID Ahmedabad, the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT), Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Government of India set up four new NIDs for design education; namely, NID Andhra Pradesh, NID Haryana, NID Madhya Pradesh, and NID Assam all on the lines of NID Ahmedabad. As envisaged in the NDP, the Centre also set up the India Design Council (IDC) on March 2, 2009 with Director NID as its Member Secretary. NID's collaboration with several national and international institutions has helped foster a culture of scientific enquiry through collaborative partnerships; for the faculty and students, this has become a platform for exchanging knowledge and ideas.

NID is a unique institution with design excellence, intellectual wealth, and a time-tested educational culture that is instrumental in addressing social problems and concerns. Today, the institute's graduates are active in all sectors of the economy, and many have distinguished themselves in fields as diverse as textiles, product design, craft design and promotion, advertising, filmmaking, multimedia, automobile design, developmental communication as well as design education. The institute believes that good design is good business and that it contributes to economic prosperity and better quality of life.



HISTORY

The establishment of NID was as an outcome of several local and global forces. The late 1950s saw a confluence of these forces, and this was a significant era for Indian culture and education. This was a time for reappraisal and reconstruction in a newly-independent India. A young nation was confronted with the mammoth task of nation building, of balancing age-old traditions with modern technology and ideas. The Modern Movement, the philosophy of Machine Aesthetics, and revolutionary experimentation in the arts, architecture, and design were all taking place at the same time. There was a search for the Indian identity across all aspects of life.


In 1955, Pupul Jayakar, the noted writer on Indian craft traditions and the founder of the Indian Handlooms and Handicrafts Export Council (HHEC) met the renowned American designer Charles Eames at the Museum of Modern Art in New York. The museum had organised a unique exhibition titled 'The Textiles and Ornamental Arts of India'. This would be the beginning of a lifelong dialogue between these two eminent individuals.

At the same time, the then Government of India was considering establishing an institute of design based on the advice of Pupul Jayakar and other like-minded people. The 1950s was a decade of rapid industrialisation in India, and clearly, the need for such an institute grew stronger. In 1957, the Government of India requested the Ford Foundation to invite Charles Eames and Ray Eames to visit India. Charles Eames and Ray Eames travelled to all parts of the country, meeting and talking to writers, craftspersons, architects, scientists, industrialists, educators, and philosophers. They extensively photographed their travel across the country.

On April 7, 1958, the Eameses presented *The India Report* to the Government of India. This report defined the underlying spirit that would lead to the founding of NID and the simultaneous beginning of design education in India. It recommended a problem-solving design consciousness that linked learning with actual experience and suggested that the designer could be a bridge between tradition and modernity. The report called upon future designers to re-examine the alternatives of growth available to the country at that time.

Based on the recommendations made in *The India Report*, the Government of India, with assistance from the Ford Foundation and the Sarabhai family, established the National Institute of Industrial Design, as it was originally called, as an autonomous all-India body in September 1961 at Ahmedabad.

Today, NID is a pioneer in industrial design education after Bauhaus and Ulm in Germany and is known for its pursuit of design excellence to make 'Designed in India, Made for the World' a reality. NID's graduates have made a mark in key sectors of commerce, industry, thought leadership, and social development.





CAMPUSES OF THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF DESIGN, AHMEDABAD

AHMEDABAD CAMPUS

Situated on the banks of the Sabarmati River, the NID Ahmedabad Campus, as very the first campus to be established, offers eight courses towards the Bachelor of Design (B.Des.) programme, seven courses towards the Master of Design (M.Des.) programme, and also the Doctoral Programme in Design. Apart from design education, the NID Ahmedabad Campus houses different departments which provide hands-on, project-based educational platforms through its various departments such as the Integrated Design Services, Research & Development, Continuing Education Programmes, Centre for Teaching & Learning, NID Press and several others.



GANDHINAGAR CAMPUS

Considering new initiatives in education and the need for focused, research-led postgraduate programmes, an extension campus was established at Gandhinagar in a 15-acre plot in July 2004.

The first phase of the construction project covering the hostel block, faculty residence, and academic block was completed with procurement and installation of interior systems/LAN/WAN and the academic activities commenced from the new academic block from the Academic Year 2008–09.

To start with, the postgraduate courses in Software and User Interface Design, Information and Digital Design, and New Media Design were conducted from the transit campus at Gandhinagar. With the completion of the first phase of construction (Academic Block and Living Spaces), four more postgraduate programmes; namely, Lifestyle Accessory Design, Apparel Design, Toy & Game Design, and Strategic Design Management from the Ahmedabad Campus were moved to the Gandhinagar Campus from the Academic Year 2008–09.


With the completion of phase-II of the Academic Block, two more postgraduate programmes; namely, Photography Design and Transportation & Automobile Design were moved from the Ahmedabad Campus to the Gandhinagar Campus from the Academic Year 2011–12.



BENGALURU CAMPUS

The NID Bengaluru Campus is located in Yeshwanthapura, in the northwestern part of Bengaluru city in the state of Karnataka. It was set up in collaboration with the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT), Ministry of Commerce and Industry and the Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology, Government of India. The campus was inaugurated in March 2006 and today stands as a compact set-up on a small 2-acre site. The campus commenced with two postgraduate programmes: Design for Digital experience and Design for Retail experience from the academic year 2007–2008.

Today, the NID Bengaluru campus offers a Masters in Design (M.Des.) in Design for Retail Experience, Digital Game Design, Information Design, Interaction Design, and Universal Design.





NID'S EVOLVING MANDATE

NID's mandate is to offer world-class design education and promote design awareness and application towards improving the quality of life by or through the fulfilment of the following:

- Providing world-class design education to create design professionals of excellence who can help meet India's diverse design needs and create leaders in design education and research by recognising the changes in the economic and business environments in a global context.
- Encouraging the scaling up of quality design professionals and faculty through existing and new institutional mechanisms.
- Becoming a repository of design knowledge, experience, and information on products, systems, materials, design, and production processes related to traditional as well as modern technologies.
- Upgrading the design of products and systems of everyday use with an aim to bring in indigenous design solutions by focusing on affordable design for the masses.
- Undertaking fundamental and applied research to create cutting-edge knowledge in diverse areas of design and allied fields.
- Helping place designers in key sectors of national need for benchmarking of standards of design education and practice and encouraging them to 'think global and act local'.
- Offering integrated design consultancy services and providing opportunities to faculty and students to familiarise them with the practical applications of design knowledge while generating revenues simultaneously.
- Providing design inputs with the aim of using design as an integrating force in varied areas such as science, technology, and management.

Also, improving the quality of life through welldesigned products, services, processes, and systems.

- Humanising technology and integrating the physical with the virtual and digital worlds through better information and interface design by moving towards a holistic creative experience.
- Providing sustainable design interventions for crafts; handloom; rural technology; small, medium, and large-scale enterprises; and outreach programmes for capacity, capability, and institution building. All this would help create employment opportunities.



NOTEWORTHY EVENTS OF THE YEAR

Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between NID Ahmedabad and SAP Labs India Pvt Ltd.

An MoU was signed between NID Ahmedabad and SAP Labs India Pvt Ltd at Bengaluru at the SAP Labs India headquarters in Whitefield on the April 04 by the SVP & MD, SAP Labs India Sindhu Gangadharan and at the NID Bengaluru campus on April 12 by Director NID Ahmedabad Praveen Nahar.

This MoU aims to foster collaborations between the two organisations in the area of research in subjects of common interest, to facilitate knowledge sharing and design mentorship for students to make them prepared for the (IT) industry and initiate various formats of engagement and interaction for conversations and exploration of ideas on design such as expert talks, workshops, hackathons, exhibitions, and design fests.





NID Ahmedabad Designed the India Pavilion at Festival de Cannes held from May 16–27, 2023

This pavilion was a tribute to our vibrant creative economy, where the Saraswati Yantra meets the colours of our national flag.

- Theme: The theme of the India Pavilion at Cannes this year was 'Showcasing India's Creative Economy' to the global community. India is proud to participate in the Cannes Film Festival once again, with the spirit of "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam" or "One Earth
 One Family · One Future" drawn from the ancient Sanskrit text of the Maha Upanishad and the theme of India's G20 Presidency.
- Design Concept-The Saraswati Yantra: The pavilion design was inspired by the Saraswati Yantra, the abstract representation of the goddess Saraswati, keeper of knowledge, music, art, speech wisdom, and learning. The earliest known goddess from the Rigveda, she is one of the Tridevis. The geometric design was patterned across the pavilion to bless one with curiosity, intense yearning to learn, perseverance, continuity, concentration, and humility.
- Colours: The colours of the pavilion were inspired from the vibrant colours of India's national flag

 saffron, white, green, and blue. Saffron for the strength and courage of the country, white for the inner peace and truth, green for showcasing fertility, growth, and auspiciousness of the land, and blue for the law of dharma and truth.

IXDS: Interaction Design Symposium

NID Bengaluru unveiled 'IXDS: Interaction Design Symposium' on May 18, 2023, dedicated to exploring the landscape of design in the era of emergent users and evolving technologies. The inaugural session featured Prof. Anirudha Joshi, from IDC School of Design at IIT Bombay.

NID Ahmedabad Signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with ALIMCO Kanpur

On June 07, 2023, NID Ahmedabad signed an MoU with the Artificial Limbs Manufacturing Corporation of India (ALIMCO), Kanpur for the design and development of user-based products in the area of Design for Special Needs.

This MOU aims at collaboration between NID and ALIMCO in the fields of Product Development in the area of Design for Special Needs with a view to a) Design, research & develop products, b) Innovate design ideas, and c) Reinforce the best design practices in Design for special needs as well as manufacturing and distribution of selected designs for the benefit of Divyangajan, Senior citizens and related stakeholders at large.

The collaborative activities will include design innovation through academic classroom courses and projects, internships, and graduation projects, joint national/international workshops, seminars, exhibitions, and publications involving multiple stakeholders in this field as well as working towards improvement in the existing ALIMCO products in terms of aesthetics, ergonomics, features and others through Design Clinic Scheme workshops.



International Yoga Day s Celebrated at NID Ahmedabad

On June 21, 2023, International Yoga Day was celebrated at NID Ahmedabad with the participation of students, faculty, and staff.

The 9th National Handloom Day

To commemorate the Swadeshi Movement, which was launched on the August 07, 1905 for promoting the use of indigenous products, including handloom fabrics and encouraging self-reliance and resilience, the Textile Design and Apparel Design disciplines of NID put up displays to celebrate the 9th National Handloom Day on August 07, 2023 at the Ahmedabad and Gandhinagar campuses.

To honour this legacy, NID curated a display showcasing the diversity in handwoven fabrics through both student as well as collaborative projects. These were followed by a discussion at the respective locations. Some of the key points deliberated upon during the discussions were:

- The present state of handlooms in India.
- Challenges faced by the artisans in the handloom sector.
- Prior experience of students and faculty on working with handloom-based brands and weavers.
- 'How handloom is turning into a luxury/heirloom piece rather than an everyday commodity'.
- Handlooms and the local narratives around it and vice versa.
- Understanding the designer's role in supporting handlooms.

'Thatheras of Jandiala Guru' Exhibition

The 'Thatheras of Jandiala Guru' Exhibition was







displayed at Government Museum and Art Gallery Chandigarh from August 11 to 13, 2023. The Ministry of Minority Affairs, Government of India has appointed NID as one of the 'Knowledge Partners' for the USTTAD scheme. The Project was launched by the Honourable Prime Minister for the benefit of minority communities of India who are engaged in the practice of traditional crafts.

Under this scheme, the Thathera Hand-Beaten Metal Craft of Jandiala Guru (Amritsar) was identified. Practiced since Maharaja Ranjit Singh's time, this is the only craft of India to be recognised as UNESCO's Intangible Cultural Heritage.

NID had successfully concluded the second (July 10 to July 22) and third (July 31 to August 08) Design Development Workshops at Jandiala Guru with 22 artisans, including 2 master artisans.

A key success of the workshop was co-creating contemporary lifestyle objects of utility and delight. NID's designers and the artisans tweaked, modified the existing processes and at times, introduced new techniques to facilitate the creation of easier and simpler forms. The artisans' created new forms explored new techniques and tools and surfaces beyond the traditional.

Making of Smritivan Museum Documentary Screened at NID Ahmedabad

As a part of celebrating one year of Smritivan, India's largest memorial museum, a documentary 'Making of Smritivan Earthquake Museum-A Film by Design Factory India' was showcased at the NID Ahmedabad on **September 01, 2023.**

The event featured a special talk by film writer and actor Atul Tiwari on the topic 'Storytelling in Spaces' and an introduction from the editor of Architecture+Design Magazine Seema Sreedharan. A momentous occasion that was an enriching experience for all attendees.

My Jesse James Adventure & Other Stories: Photography Exhibition by Colette Copeland This exhibition opened on September 27, 2023 at the Design Gallery, NID Gandhinagar Campus.







The exhibition was inaugurated by Director NID Ahmedabad Praveen Nahar.

In addition to the work by Copeland, the exhibition also hosted a display of Anthotype Prints by students from Photography Design (Semester 3). These prints were the outcome of a workshop that Colette conducted for these students. Anthotype prints are a form of alternative printing process in which a photographic image is created using photosensitive materials and emulsions from natural materials.

Annual Swachhata Hi Sewa (SHS) Campaign was Celebrated by NID Ahmedabad on October 02, 2023 In order to spread awareness about cleanliness, hazards of plastic usage, and the need to keep environment clean, NID Ahmedabad under the Swachhata Hi Sewa Campaign 2023 took the Swachhata pledge, undertook Shramdaan in campus and its surroundings. A composting machine was activated with distribution of dry and wet waste bins to residents emphasising the need to segregate waste at the source. Students, staff, and faculty participated in all these activities with great spirit and enthusiasm.

Relating Systems Thinking to Design Symposium (RSD 12) from October 08 to 09, 2023

NID Ahmedabad concluded the 2-day Relating Systems Thinking and Design Symposium RSD12 India Hub event on October 09, 2023. This year's theme for the NID hub was 'Systemic Design for Hopeful Futures', an approach to design that seeks to create solutions and strategies that are optimistic, inclusive, inspiring, and empowering. This approach is rooted in the belief that design can be a powerful tool for positive change and that designers have a responsibility to create futures that are sustainable, equitable, and desirable.

This year, RSD12 adopted a hub model offering a 15-day collaborative programme live streaming from 12 hubs and the cornerstone event in Washington, DC with Georgetown University as a host university, 12 hubs located NID in Ahmedabad, Amsterdam, Bogotá, Kihcihkaw-Âski, Kingston upon Thames, Loughborough, Monterrey, Nordmark Forest, Pittsburgh, Toronto, Turin, and Vancouver.



At the NID hub participants from various institutions attended a series of 6 workshops (3 in-person and 3 in hybrid mode). An exhibition of complexity maps (physical and digital) done by NID students which were part of this year's RSD symposium were also put up during the event.

A series of paper presentations around "Language & Al" presented by design researchers from US, Sweden, and Netherlands held across the globe was attended by students and faculty on campus. Faculty members from NID presented two papers: 'A Conceptual Model For A Systems Approach To Policy Design For A Sustainable Future' by **Gayatri Menon (Dr.)** and 'A Systemic Design Approach to Revitalising the Palmyra Palm Economy' by **S. Shankar, Praveen Nahar**, and **Sahil Thappa**.

The highlight of the event was the Keynote Address 'The Health System Transformation Playbook' by **Dr. Ng Yeuk Fan**, Director & Head of Corporate Development at Yishun Health, Singapore.

The RSD12 India Hub event chaired by Director, NID Ahmedabad **Praveen Nahar** and convened by **Neha Mandalik** and **Sahil Thappa**, Industrial Design faculty members with the help of student volunteers.

RSD symposiums began in 2012 in Oslo at the Oslo School of Architecture and Design. Since then, a symposium has been held each year. Each symposium draws new studies, theoretical work, and practices from across many disciplines contributing to complex design issues, social systems and complex policy, socio-ecological sustainability, critical cultural and development perspectives, and emerging practices and methodology.

Prof. Kenya Hara at NID Ahmedabad

NID Ahmedabad was honoured to welcome **Prof. Kenya Hara**, Graphic Designer, Curator and Writer & Professor from Japan November 23, 2023.

During his visit Director, NID Ahmedabad **Praveen Nahar** and senior colleagues of NID had a tour of the campus which included the NID's Design Panorama, Craft Display in the Aquarium as well as a special display of works by 4th year undergraduate students.



A display of books authored by him and which are a part of NID's Knowledge Management Centre (NID) too was put up and he signed all these books in NID's collection.

Later, a curated interaction between Prof. Hara and the students and faculty of NID was organised by the Baatein team.

NID Ahmedabad designed OSOP outlets at 1037 Railway Stations in 27 Indian States

There are 1,134 outlets which are functional at 1,037 stations in 27 states under the OSOP scheme. These outlets have been designed by NID Ahmedabad for the Indian Railways.

The railways' "One Station One Product" Scheme, under which uniquely designed sale outlets are offered to locals to sell indigenous products, is now operational at 1,037 stations across the country.

The scheme was launched on May 20 last year after a 15-day pilot project which received encouraging response from local artisans, craftsmen and workers.

As on November 9 this year, 1,134 OSOP outlets were operational at 1,037 stations in 27 states. While Tamil Nadu topped the list with 146 outlets at 137 stations, West Bengal was second with a similar number of outlets at 123 stations. Uttar Pradesh stood third with 112 outlets at 105 stations.

NID Ahmedabad Organised a Two-Day Exposure Visit for CBSE School Principals NID Ahmedabad successfully organised a two-day Exposure Visit for 52 CBSE School Principals from November 30 to December 01, 2023. This was a part of an initiative by the CBSE under the National Education Policy 2020. The programme was anchored by a Principal Faculty and supported by other faculty and staff members from the NID Ahmedabad Campus.

As per the primary goal of this CBSE sponsored programme, participants were introduced to the advanced systems, processes, and techniques practiced by NID Ahmedabad in upscaling the educational quotient among its students.







This, when put into use in existing CBSE schools would leverage the current educational pedagogy as envisioned under National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The programme was framed to discuss exposure to interactive learning, access to different environments, hands-on experiential learning, live project scenarios, social interactions, latest trends in harnessing and intelligent practices generally used in current the design education curriculum at NID Ahmedabad.

National Workshop on Design Education and NEP at Vanijya Bhawan, New Delhi from December -01 to 02, 2023

Tulip Sinha, faculty member Universal Design, participated in the National Workshop on Design Education and NEP (National Education Policy 2020), hosted by NID Kurukshetra along with the Director, NID Ahmedabad Praveen Nahar and three other colleagues from the Ahmedabad campus: Gayatri Menon (Dr.), Andrea Noronha, and S. Guruprasad.

Tulip Sinha was also a moderator and presenter for the group that discussed 'Equity and Inclusivity in Design Education'.

'Water Matters': International Open Electives: Immerse, Provoke and Discourse

The exhibition titled 'Water Matters', was held at the end of the two week annual open electives workshop at NID. This exhibition reflected the design-led approach addressing a pressing global concern. The theme guided students in exploring the diverse facets of water and its role in design. Courses unveiled the potential which water has in crafting artefacts, shaping civilizations, and disrupting lives. Students delved into designing with and for water, fostering a discourse on the ongoing water crisis. Their creative expressions aimed to inspire collective action, reinforcing the belief that 'together we can make a change'. The exhibit invites exploration of powerful messages in each creative endeavour. Around **448 students** had participated in **31 electives** that were offered across NID's three campuses.

Webinar on Kerala Urban Dialogues

A webinar titled 'Designing Systems for Socio-Ecological Cohesion' was organised on December 18, 2023 with a live streaming of the same. This seventh session of Kerala Urban Dialogues at NID Ahmedabad was presided over by Prof. Ezio Manzini of Italy who is the President of DESIS Network and Honorary Professor at the Politecnico di Milano.

Jawaja Book Handed to NID Ahmedabad

In an event organised at NID Ahmedabad on January 3, 2024, artisans from Jawaja handed over former NID Director Ashoke Chatterjee's book on the NIDinitiated Jawaja project. The book has been published in English as well as in Hindi.

Alumni Meeting of 5 Institutes at NIFT Bengaluru Mamata Rao (Dr.) and Chakradhar Saswade represented NID at the fourth edition of the Professional Meet of Alumni of 5 Institutes (FDDI, IIFD, IIP, NID & NIFT) held on February 16, 2023 at NIFT Bengaluru. She presented the institutional introduction and overview for NID in the event.

Samsung's PRISM Programme

At NID, these programmes comprise both Bachelor of Design (B.Des.) and Master of Design (M.Des.) programmes. The Bachelor's programme is of a fouryear duration for 10+2 school leavers-level leading to the Bachelor of Design (B.Des.) programme and the Master's programme is of a two-and-a-half- year duration leading to the Master of Design (M.Des.) programme.

Strategic Design Management, Design for Retail Experience, and a common interdisciplinary stream for undergraduate, postgraduate, and research programmes.




















ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

BACHELOR OF DESIGN (B.Des.)

The Bachelor of Design (B.Des.) programme is offered in 8 disciplines covering 4 faculty streams. The programme spans four years (eight semesters) including a two-semester Design Foundation Studies programme. Despite being a generic design programme, it offers project-level specialisation in different areas of:

Industrial Design

Ceramic & Glass Design, Furniture & Interior Design, and Product Design

Communication Design

Animation Film Design, Exhibition Design, Film & Video Communication, and Graphic Design

Textile and Apparel Design Textile Design

MASTER OF DESIGN (M.Des.)

Interactive areas of project-level specialisation are offered in 19 Master of Design (M.Des.) programmes:

The M.Des. programme is offered in 19 specialisations (disciplines) across all five faculty streams. Interactive areas of project-level specialisation are offered in:

Animation Film Design: classical animation, computer animation, model animation, and animation for the web

Apparel Design: ready-to-wear range for women, costumes for film and theatre, work and protective wear, and accessory design

Ceramic & Glass Design: lifestyle products, studio pottery, and sanitaryware

Design for Retail Experience: Designed for the candidates from various backgrounds, it looks at the retail industry in a holistic manner.

Digital Game Design: To train, nurture, and combine students' creative imagination with latest technologies to create games and experiences. The

graduates of this programme will be highly required in the digital entertainment and computer gaming Industry.

Film & Video Communication: marketing communication (advertising and corporate films), social communication (developmental and educational short films), and design for tourism industry

Furniture & Interior Design: home furniture system, office furniture system, and retail furniture system

Graphic Design: design for publications, marketing communications, and social and developmental communications

Information Design: A multidimensional programme that synchronises the fields of design, visual aesthetics, computer science, statistics, and humanities to inculcate a transdisciplinary proficiency into the future information design professionals.

Interaction Design: design and behaviour of various forms of digital products ranging from mobile phones, web-based to dynamic ones in gaming, education, transportation, healthcare, banking, and retail and other domains

Lifestyle Accessory Design: personal accessory products, products for living, and workspaces

New Media Design: web design, game design, interactive media, and software industry

Photography Design: visual artists, photographers, and cinematographers

Product Design: consumer products (electronic and entertainment products, white goods), transportation, capital equipment and machine tools, and toys

Strategic Design Management: strategic designers, design entrepreneurs, and design managers

Textile Design: constructed textiles (woven, knitted, non-woven textiles), surface design print, mixed media, embroidery, finishing techniques

(surface ornamentation), textiles for apparels, and technical fabrics

Toy & Game Design: educational and developmental toys, outdoor play equipment, soft toys, and multimedia games

Transportation & Automobile Design: transportation and automotive sectors of the industry

Universal Design: system-level design development of products adaptive for diverse users across cultures, social factors, transgenerational, physical, and cognitive abilities and inabilities

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY (Ph.D.) IN DESIGN PROGRAMME

This programme gives impetus to design research priorities for its current faculty in collaboration with researchers who are selected as Ph.D. scholars under faculty supervision.





EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES

The institute is equipped with the Skill Development Lab, Design Vision Centre, Innovation Lab, and specialised labs for ceramics and glass, leather and plastics, textile and apparel design studios, computer labs, and the Knowledge Management Centre (housing approximately 63000 books and a large collection of journals, e-Books, e-Journals, audio-visual materials, and prototypes).

It has a contemporary IT Centre and other wellequipped labs with about 1000 computers (in Ahmedabad, Gandhinagar, and Bengaluru campuses) including 700 high-end machines and software. The entire campus, including hostels, is connected with Local Area Networking for both the internet and intranet facilities with around 1800 connections and Wi-Fi.

The Design Vision Centre with Rapid Prototyping (RP) and High-Performance Visualisation (HPV) solutions are other significant facilities. Photography studio and print labs, video and animation studios, and skilled technical staff assist design students in their learning process. The Design Aptitude Test (DAT) (Prelims) for admissions to the M.Des & B.Des. programmes for the academic year 2024–2025 were conducted at 47 test centres respectively across 22 cities (Ahmedabad, Bengaluru, Bhopal, Bhubaneswar, Chandigarh, Chennai, Dehradun, Guwahati, Hyderabad, Jaipur, Kochi, Kolkata, Kurukshetra, Lucknow, Mumbai, Nagpur, New Delhi, Patna, Raipur, Ranchi, Thiruvananthapuram and Vijayawada) in India on December 24, 2023.

A total of 15839 applications were received for the B.Des. programme. In all, 15269 candidates (including Overseas candidates) appeared for the DAT Prelims exam for 144 seats (including 19 supernumerary seats in Overseas category) in B.Des.; 75 seats at NID Andhra Pradesh, 75 seats at NID Assam, 86 seats at NID Haryana (including 11 supernumerary seats in Overseas category), and 86 seats at NID Madhya Pradesh (including 11 supernumerary seats in Overseas category). The total number of applicants for the M.Des. programme across 19 disciplines was 6897. In all, 6612 candidates (including Overseas candidates) appeared for a total of 402 seats in the M.Des. programme.

The results of the M.Des. DAT Prelims were declared on February 16, 2024 while that of B.Des. shall be announced on April 04, 2024. A total of 1871 candidates have been shortlisted for B.Des. DAT Mains while 1328 candidates are appearing for the M.Des. DAT Mains. The M.Des. DAT Mains are scheduled from March 04 to April 04, 2024 and B.Des. on April 28, 2024.



43RD CONVOCATION



NID Ahmedabad celebrated its 43rd Convocation on January 04, 2024; and Dr. Pramod Varma, Chief Architect Aadhaar, UPI and India Stack was the convocation speaker. The convocation ceremony was followed by the inauguration of several events & displays associated with this important celebration of the Institute.

A total of 477 students from B.Des., M.Des. and PhD Programmes graduated from 20 varied disciplines.

Theme and Exhibits

The theme of NID's 43rd Convocation was 'Collective Transformation' that is how we Converge, Connect, Experiment, Transform, Diverge & Transcend. Inspired by Kaleidoscope, the identity for NID's 43rd Convocation symbolised the evolution of students into designers. It highlighted the way students come from diverse origins and converge within a shared space, fostering connections, collaborations, and collective growth. Along this trajectory, the students undergo personal development whereby they cultivate greater empathy, sharpen their skills, and identify their niche. Even if the students diverge into individual paths beyond this point, as young designers, they remain intrinsically linked to their foundational roots.

To celebrate the momentous occasion, several were organised around the convocation. The Annual Design Show 2023 titled 'LINES', curated by a team of students and faculty members was a collective reflection tool created a space for exploring the







works undertaken at NID Ahmedabad and its extension campuses in Gandhinagar and Bengaluru throughout the academic year. The exhibition sought to highlight transformational processes and moments where learners engage in the process of framing and reframing questions that drive their creative work and projects. LINES, Annual Design Show 2023 deconstructed the works into categories of 'Demand', 'Depict', 'Defend', 'Deploy', and 'Deviate'.

The Design Panorama gallery had an exhibition that brought together an array of material from the institution's archive, Knowledge Management Centre and related networks and repositories. It explored the histories of cybernetics as a phenomenon and its relationship to design, and design education to enliven urgent debates around AI.

Tune in, Boot up, Plug-in: National Institute of Design's Intertwinements with Cybernetics

This exhibition charted Cybernetics and allied nodes while positioning NID as a junction, as a port, and as a feedback loop. There were other pop-up displays by various disciplines, research and integrated service departments and on the concluded open elective 'Water Matters' as a reflection of a design-led approach by our students to comprehend the vast ongoing water crisis.

FACULTY ACCOLADES AND NOTEWORTHY ACTIVITIES

- Balaji Rengarajan, Principal Designer, Universal Design, participated as an external expert member for the Comprehensive Design Project Jury at the Department of Integrated Design, University of Moratuwa, Sri Lanka from May 08 to 12, 2023.
- 'Designing Everyday Experience' was a three-day international conference put together by the Everyday Aesthetics Network and the Moholy-Nagy University of Art and Design Budapest (MOME) from May 10 to 13, 2023. The aim of the event was to offer an opportunity for those with an interest in the philosophy and aesthetics of everyday life and design to share and discuss work, in the hope of furthering dialogue in this area.
 Tulip Sinha, Associate Senior Faculty, Universal Design presented her work on 'Conversation as Capital', where conversations are seen as a pedagogical tool and their contribution to the everyday aesthetic within learning environments.
- Global Design Course: Tactile Domestica 2024 This was an international academic and industry collaboration between India, England, and Portugal where nine sessions (online) were held from January 24 to March 20, 2024. This collaboration brought together students from NID Ahmedabad and Birmingham City University in the UK. Three faculty members Neha Mandlik (NID Ahmedabad), Nuno Lourinho Pereira Jose, and Ana Araujo (BCU) led this course along with mentoring and guiding the students. Paulo Estrada, the CEO of Sofalca, Portugal sponsored this course and shared his experience of creating this material and its possibilities to students. Students worked collaboratively, explored, and designed domestic products and interior surface applications using sustainable cork as the primary material during this module. This initiative provided valuable international industry exposure to our students, allowing them to work with a









world leader such as Sofalca and gain insights into sustainable design practices.

- Mamata Rao, Dean, NID Bengaluru Campus was invited to participate in a panel discussion organised by the G20 Culture working team for the session titled 'Protection and Promotion of Diversity of Cultural Expression in a Digital Environment' conducted on May 08, 2023. Later, she was invited as a quest of honour for the 'Real Woman Awards' ceremony held on May 12, 2023 held to recognise and motivate the contribution of women entrepreneurs in the construction industry, which is mainly male-dominated. She was also invited to work as a member of the 'DRM Gurukooll' organising committee and as a speaker for a session titled 'Researching Thinking in Design: A Look at Selected Publications'. The first 'DRM Gurukooll' was an event that was held from July 02 to 07, 2023 at the Indian Institute of Science, Bengaluru. The objectives are to expose early (career) design researchers to the current understanding of design and design research by introducing them to common design research methods and methodologies.
- The Seed Research Grant undertaken by **Sahil Thappa** over the past two years to setup an Anti-Disciplinary Lab has yielded graduation projects, research projects, participatory workshops, exhibitions, and publications. Following activities were carried out between April 2023 and March 2024 at the User Centred Design Lab:
 - 1. 'Bionics and Computation' Graduation Project by Amogh Jadhav (July 2023)

This project aims to look at biomimicry in design through the 'bottoms-up' approach. It is about developing a more in-depth understanding of the various forms, structures, and processes in nature. Understanding why and how they came about and applying this understanding to industrial design. This project uses the lens of computation and computational thinking in applying the principles of nature to direct making. To solve today's complex problems it is imperative that we look towards a new and cross-disciplinary approach and combine the best of knowledge from multiple disciplines.

- 2. KMC Summer Internship in Collaboration with User Centred Design Lab on AR/VR by Shahid Javed Ali (May–June 2023) This summer internship explored methods and frameworks to efficiently integrate VR/ AR systems within the KMC. This led to a document which contains all the outcomes/ processes/explorations and experiments done
 - processes/explorations and experiments done throughout the duration of his internship at the KMC, NID Ahmedabad. It includes foundational propositions to efficiently integrate AR/VR based interventions within the existing ecosystem of KMC. It also contains frameworks, proposals, resources, and methodologies developed to do so. It also includes steps needed to take this project further to build upon the established base in terms of potential project briefs/directions that interested students/interns /external bodies could work and develop upon.
- 3. 'Design and Al' Graduation Project by Shahid Javed Ali (September 2023-Ongoing) This project aims to probe into the dynamic intersection of design and Al. Using experimental and explorative approaches, it aims to uncover new insights and dimensions in an attempt to innovate tools, processes, methodologies, and products. This project questions:
 - What do design processes of the future look like?
 - What would the role of AI be in the context of Industry 4.05tt?

- How can designers take more responsible decisions based on data-driven inputs and Al tools?
- How can AI aid one in exploring and pushing the boundaries of design concepts?
- How might we create a more democratic/ inclusive discussion and participation about the social role and impact of AI?
- How might one use speculative design tools and frameworks to explore new perspectives, possibilities, and ways of thinking about living with AI?

Under this project, multiple participatory workshops were carried out at the User Centred Design Lab. Details are as follows:

- W01: Artificially Designed / Product Design Student / Two-day workshop. A two-day workshop exploring text to Image LLMs as a tool to conceptualise and ideate out of the ordinary biomorphic forms and industrial products.
- W02: AI for Technically Complex Products / M.Des. 22 / One-day workshop. Workshop exploring AI as a tool to build visual repository for ideating technically complex products-How would one design a shoe inspired by nature?
- W04: The GIMF-The Great Indian Mundane Futures/ Studio Carbon/ Oneday workshop. The GIMF workshop aimed at exploring AI by co designing mundane products, systems and scenarios that might exist in a plausible Indian future-aligning with ongoing projects at the Studio, we used AI as a visual and demonstrative prototyping tool to communicate these futures.

- W05-AI x Textiles: Speculative Indian Futurewear/TD Students/Two-day workshop. How might something as sentimental and tangible such as textiles use AI in their design process? We cocreated wearables from a plausible speculated Indian futures. Following a speculative design-narrative building framework, further prototyping two physical prototypes.
- W09-A lost and found future / Foundation 23 / One-day workshop. Workshop aimed to explore and better understand Google's new Text to Image LLM as a way to explore Design Fiction, and Speculative Prototyping in a fun activity-What objects might you lose and find in NID in the context of a future narrative?

4. Supporting Eye Spy for Workshops and Exhibitions Over the Past One and Half Year

- Austin Davis (Faculty, Toy & Game Design)
 was invited by Kiran Vaghela for conducting a
 workshop at Karigarshala, Bhuj, Gujarat on April
 01, 2023. The workshop was called 'Introduction
 to Design Thinking, Creativity, and Toys' and it was
 organised for students of Karigarshala (artisans'
 school under Hunnarshala where dropouts from
 the formal education system aged between 16
 to 18 are trained in carpentry and masonry). This
 has resulted in a plan for a future workshop with
 faculty members from Toy & Game Design.
- The faculty team of **Shekhar Bhattacharjee** and **Austin Davis** (both from Toy & Game Design) was invited to participate in a workshop organized by ICDS, WCD at GNLU Gandhinagar on May 31, 2023. The workshop was held in collaboration with UNICEF and focused on 'Developing Guidelines for Child-Friendly Anganwadis'. Their inputs were sought to strengthen the anganwadis for the betterment of children and get a design perspective on guidelines development.

- Faculty from NID Bengaluru Nijoo Dubey and Teaching Associate Athul Dinesh conducted the 'One District One Product' workshop at Kinhal. This workshop was held from June 22 to 23, 2023. It was a design sensitisation workshop to help artisans enrich their craft and expand their business.
- A design sensitisation workshop was conducted focusing on the Channapatna Lacquerware Crafts with a group of 50 participants at the Channapatna Craft Park. It was a collaboration between the woodcraft artisans of Channapatna and design practitioners and educators from the National Institute of Design, under the One District One Product (ODOP) initiative by the Government of India. It was conducted by Tulip Sinha (Universal Design) and Athul Dinesh. Sinha also presented her paper on 'Conversation as Capital' at the 'Futuring Design Education: FDE'24', a conference at IIT Delhi. She chaired sessions on poster presentations and offered the 'Sustainability & Design' course module (UD 22 batch) in collaboration with Diya Foundation, Bengaluru. Students worked with children with special needs at the foundation and proposed design intervention for strategy/product development for economic sustainability. The workshop was held from January 29 to February 09, 2024.
 - **Balaji Rengarajan**, a faculty from the Universal Design discipline served as one of the jury members for the Bharath Cycle Design Challenge (BCDC) 2023, a joint initiative of the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) and Namma Nimma Cycle Foundation, Bengaluru. The event sought to encourage innovation and creativity in design and making of electric and non-electric bicycles in the categories of cargo and commute cycles. The one-day event held at Chanakya University, Bengaluru comprised exhibitions/presentations of the national-level entries by students' teams, selection of the best design, and an award ceremony with

Prof T G Seetharam, Chairman AICTE who was also the chief guest.

 Nijoo Dubey (Faculty, Universal Design) along with Prof. Sudhakar Damodaraswamy (R V University) co-authored a paper titled 'A Colour Value Framework (CVF) for Colour Design Of Lifestyle Products'. This paper was presented at a conference organised by the Colour Society of Thailand at Chiang Rai, Thailand along with the International Colour Association (AIC). Dubey, along with Teaching Associate Athul Dinesh from the Universal Design discipline conducted a workshop at Bangkok, Thailand on June 30 at the IFA International Conference. Through a role play, the workshop enabled the participants to understand the difficulties faced by the ageing population across the world.

The collection is a testament to the idea of making the most of what we have, and not letting anything go to waste. The research undertaken for the project reveals that a significant amount of clothing ends up in

landfills due to reasons such as being out of style, ripped, or stained. It is shocking to know that a single denim jeans takes hundreds of resources to produce. 'The Show Must Go On' employs laser cutting techniques to create a uniform surface in the textiles. The layering of denim in areas where maximum wear and tear happens (joints) has increased the garment's longevity. The collection's unique design and eco-friendly approach are a breath of fresh air in the fashion industry. Vastraansh's conscious clothing is a call to action, reminding us of our responsibility to the environment, and the importance of entertainment in our lives.

Apart from institutions and organisations, NID works closely with foreign missions in India. With their intervention in the recent past, prestigious events, projects, exhibitions, collaborative workshops, competitions from several countries; namely, France, Germany, Great Britain, Sweden, Switzerland, Italy, Mexico, Peru, Japan, and Israel have been undertaken.

NID also gets to welcome high-ranking officials including Ambassadors and Consul-Generals which allows the institute to keep these associations thriving. Moreover, Indian missions abroad contact NID for initiating similar collaborative activities.

Launched by His Majesty King Charles III, in his former role as the Prince of Wales, and Sir Jony Ive in 2021, in partnership with the Royal College of Art, Terra Carta Design Lab aims to provide an integrated roadmap towards an inspiring, inclusive, equitable, prosperous and sustainable future for the sake of present and future generations; one that will harness the power of Nature combined with the transformative power, innovation and resources of the private sector.

This year, the Design Lab is expanding its search and has partnered with four prestigious design schools from across the world:

- 1) National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad (India)
- 2) Dubai Institute of Design and Innovation (UAE)
- 3) Rhode Island School of Design (USA)
- 4) Royal College of Art (UK)

The competition is split into stages, running from Autumn 2023 to Autumn 2024, with shortlists from each school being judged by a Global Judging Panel, led by renowned designer Sir Jony Ive. Winners will be announced in Autumn 2024.

 The Ceramic & Glass Design discipline hosted Eliza Au as Artist in Residence from December 15, 2023 to January 15, 2024. She has taught at various institutions including the Emily Carr University of Art and Design, the Alberta College of Art and Design, Monmouth College, The University of Iowa and the Alfred-CAFA (Central Academy of Fine Arts) Program in Beijing, China. Au is currently an Assistant Professor of Ceramics at the University of North Texas.

She works with intricate clay structures using 3D printing and plaster mould-making and casting techniques and during her residency at NID. She created art works to be exhibited at ICT 2024. International Open Electives

Open Electives 2023, a two-week multi-disciplinary series of workshops was held across NID's Ahmedabad, Bengaluru, and Gandhinagar campuses for the students of B.Des. and M.Des. programmes and for the exchange students from NID's partner institutions from December 11 to 22, 2023.

The overarching theme for this year's Open Elective 2023 was 'Water Matters' The story of water is essentially the story of the planet and human civilization. Water is the omnipotent force that enables life on earth. We, the humans and other life forms come from water, our bodies and the planet itself consist largely of water. Among many unique qualities of water, is its ability to exist in different states, take on versatile forms, be a drop and the ocean, move vigorously at times and embody stillness at other times. The Open Elective was an invitation to explore creative responses on the theme of water and its interpretations from practitioners across various domains. The elective is envisaged as a transdisciplinary space where varied vantage points, knowledge systems, expertise, curiosities, and practices converge towards a holistic deliberation on water. The proposals considered various trajectories spanning aspects of water in time and space, water crisis and catastrophe, water cultures and communities, water ecosystems, water politics and borders, water as sensory experience, water as memory and much more.

National and international experts from countries such as the UK, Israel, and USA offered a wide variety of courses based on areas such as visual music, dance, food practices, material cultures, Indian cultural practices, narrative styles and several others.

KNOWLEDGE MANAGEMENT CENTRE (KMC) AND NID ARCHIVES

Knowledge Management Centre (KMC)

Over the past six decades, the institute's Knowledge Management Centre (KMC)/ Resource Centre (RC) has grown exponentially with respect to its contents and the knowledge generated internally as a part of academics, consultancy, and research.

The mission of KMC/RC is to inspire a culture of knowledge exploration, creativity, and innovation within the NID community and beyond. We aspire to foster a dynamic environment that encourages quality knowledge management and serves the information needs of the Design fraternity at NID across Ahmedabad, Gandhinagar, and Bengaluru campuses. KMC is considered as one of the activity hubs of the institute and embraced a multifaceted approach in managing print, digital, audio-visual material, and prototypes, in a seamless manner. The collective strength of all resources at the KMC is aimed at giving the power to provide services under







one roof, with online resources to faculty members, students, researchers and reference requests to the institutes and researchers associated with design.

Details of various resources housed at KMC: Print Resources

KMC has a wide range of books in its resources on design, science and technology, art and architecture, paintings, history, humanities, etc. Presently the collection has approximately 78943 books and the periodical section has nearly 203 current subscriptions of journals with nearly 6066 back volumes at all three campuses. The rare and out of print collection include collections on art, architecture, paintings, history among others.

Document Collection

The document collection contains more than 6308 student Graduation Projects, 912 Colloquium Papers, 775 Craft Documentations, 700 Project Reports, 52 Design Concepts & Concerns at all three campuses. There are several other reports and documentations on various projects NID was involved in during the last six decades, which are unique with innovative themes and research-oriented studies.

Audio Visual Resources

The unique collection of audiovisual material includes films, (584 Audio cassettes, 1136 LPs, 1054 Tape/Spool, 2949 Audio disk, 7957 Video Disk, 245 16mm films, 87 35mm films. 1346 VHS, 636 Umatic, 109 Betamax, 295 Betacam, 233 MDVC, 252 Film strips,) contains NID's own works as well as the ones collected from other sources. These are mostly on the topics of design, film classics, and of course NID's own experimental and animation films. The visual collection consisting of nearly 94782 transparencies from the early 60's till date is unique in Indian landscape, art, architecture and design, along with topics like fairs & festivals, people, traditions, culture among others. NID Archives

NID Archives is the collection of materials including images, objects, prototypes, drawings, and other original documents. This collection is housed in the KMC and other departments and can be accessed for research and teaching purposes. NID Archives acquires and preserves materials of value specifically to institutional history and broadly to design history. Over the years, the KMC staff has provided support for students, faculty, and researchers from across the world who request access to the materials for their academic work. NID Archives contributes to knowledge production and to the dissemination of its collections within and beyond the institute. This has mostly been in the form of loan of archival materials for exhibitions and image licences for publication.

Vision

- To be a place for inquiry, inspiration, and research.
- To enrich people's lives by promoting research, knowledge, and enjoyment of the designed world.

Mission

- To collect, preserve, and provide access to records and artefacts, including photographs and publications that document the history and development of NID's programmes, policies, and procedures and contributions of individuals and organisations associated with it.
- To use the collections to advance creativity, critical thinking, and diversity of thought and practice, with an emphasis on supporting NID's curriculum and furthering the existing design discourse.
- To expand NIDs international reach, reputation, and impact.

Objectives

• The primary objective to establish the archives was due to its outstanding universal value as it is historically and artistically irreplaceable.

- Establish guidelines for accession and acquisition of materials of importance. Since archiving of both historical and current material is of primary importance in order to not lose a huge part of the design heritage of South Asia.
- The main consideration for building an archive includes conservation as the physical condition of the historical materials is a big concern and there is a need for urgently implementing plans to safeguard the materials while setting up an archive.
- This includes conservation (as per the necessity and based on their condition) and digitisation of the negatives, positives, prints, drawings, posters, and audio-visual materials so that the digital images can be accessed and preserved for posterity. And the physical material can be conserved and stored in a secure place so that any further deterioration of the material may be halted.
- Explore and find ways to engage with the archives and contribute further to the existing design discourse.

Activities During the Year

• Archives organized Archives Summer Lab in June 2023, with external experts S Girikumar, Noopur Desai, Sneha Ragavan, and Deepika Srivastava. S Girikumar, a senior art conservator conducted a two-day intensive session with interns on preventive conservation, as a part of which old nitrate-based film reels at KMC/Archives were marked and segregated for disposal. He also conducted an open session for the NID community called Damages, Diagnosis & Remedies: A Peep into the World of Art Conservation. Sneha Ragavan and Noopur Desai from Asia Art Archive conducted a workshop called Writing the Archive for students and an online open session for the NID community titled Archiving Art Histories from South Asia.

- Shreyasi Pathak participated in the session Archival Conservation and Preservation as a part of Milli Consortium at NCBS Archives Bengaluru during International Archives Week in June 2023.
- Tanishka Kachru and Shreyasi Pathak were part of panels on gender, sexuality, and museums and shifting roles of museums in a digital world, respectively as a part of the second edition of Bihar Museum Biennale, organized by Outlook magazine in July 2023.
- **Shilpi Dey** joined Archives as a Project Associate in July 2023.
- Acquired and moved **Benoy Sarkar's** Archive from the NID Delhi office to Ahmedabad in July 2023 with Deepshikha's help who coordinated the move from the Asia Art Archive, New Delhi office.

8 RESEARCH & DEVELOPMENT

Design Research is a proactive and exploratory way to develop design practice and education. The institute aims at creating a new body of knowledge on, and through design research.

The institute conducts design research in the areas of Industrial Design, Communication Design, Textile and Apparel Design, Lifestyle Accessory Design, IT Integrated Design and Design Management in domains related to industrial, social and cultural concerns through basic and applied research, through experimental development and other activities.

NID's design research mandate also includes setting up of Design Research Chairs, which act as catalysts for collaborative research opportunities at NID. Chair holders or Fellows and their associated labs promote holistic design thinking backed by comprehensive research, culminating in futuristic visions, envisaging a better quality of life.

NID's research initiatives are fully integrated into its undergraduate and postgraduate curricula.

NID Ford Foundation Grant is a prestigious grant awarded to the selected students of B.Des and M.Des batch who are in their final semester Graduation project. During April 2023 to March 2024, Seven students from M.Des 2021, seven students from B.Des 2019 and seven students from B.Des. 2020 were awarded the grant. The grant focuses on areas of social, economic, political, and cognitive domains, education, and health.



Learning to Weave: With Tools or Toys?

The field study was conducted in a society where women are weavers. It was done with the intention to study the culture of transfer of weaving knowledge from mothers to daughters, through means of using toys as tools. The images depict evidence gathered among the Mog community of Birchandra Nagar Village, South Tripura and Mishing community in Majuli Island, Assam in 2023.





Eco-friendly Leather Alternative: Material-driven

'Bacto Leather' is an innovative material formed through the symbiotic collaboration of bacteria and yeast. This unconventional approach leverages the unique properties of these microorganisms to create a sustainable and biofabricated alternative to traditional leather. The resulting material showcases the intersection of biotechnology, design, and fashion, offering a promising avenue for environmentally conscious leather production.

Ayush, a student of Textile Design worked on the material and was a finalist at the Woolmark Inovation Challenge.

A paper titled 'Eco-friendly Leather Alternatives: A Sustainable Approach' was presented at the International Conference on Sustainable Design Practices from November 25–27, 2023 at the National Institute of Fashion Technology, Kangra, India. Exploring Mass Production Possibilities using Solid Bamboo Faculty: Pravinsinh Solanki

This project explores solid bamboo as a sustainable industrial material for mass manufacturing. Elements of standardization, joinery and others will be explored as part of the research.



A Colour Value Framework for Colour Design of **Lifestyle Products** Faculty: Nijoo Dubey

This study probes the association between the design of Colour, Material, and Finish (CMF) for lifestyle products and the perception of a product's value proposition. This paper details a survey conducted on the reasons for the use of colour on products and the analysis of the results for discernible patterns. The outcome of the analyses is the Colour Value Framework (CVF), presented as a hierarchically organised set of vocabularies representing the dominant patterns in the use of colour for coding value propositions into products.

- Publication on experiments and methods done in the past projects is under compilation.
- 5. Workshops conducted at Science Lab include:
 - Participatory experiments and workshops: Experimenting to make versatile bio materials and materialswith customizable properties.
 - A one day workshop on 'Origami and Can Bending'.
 - 'Artificially Designed': A two-day workshop exploring text to Image LLMs as a tool to conceptualise and ideate out of the ordinary biomorphic forms and industrial products.
 - AI for Technically Complex Products: Workshop exploring AI as a tool to build visual repository for ideating technically complex products: How would one design a shoe inspired from nature?

- Workshop with Kochi Fellows: Workshop exploring use of AI to influence policy-level decision making and visualize relevant futures to communicate societal impact.

The exhibition was organized by a faculty team comprising Tanishka Kachru, Ritesh Kumar (Dr.), Vibhu Mittal, Vijaya Barge, Sneha Mundari, and Saurabh Srivastava.

On February 10 & 11, 2024, an open seminar and workshops were organized at Shanti Sadan, Ahmedabad where educators and students across institutes from Ahmedabad participated in the event. The two-day workshop at Shanti Sadan, delivered into the intricate world of colour, guided by the expertise of Dr. Marianne Keller, an art historian from the Paul Klee Foundation in Bern, Switzerland and **Cornelia Vogelsanger (Dr.)**, a distinguished anthropologist, **Gayatri Menon (Dr.) Sangita Shroff (Dr.)**, and **Rajesh Naidu (Dr.)**. The expert guided the participants through a rich exploration of the multifaceted nature of colour, transcending boundaries and inviting participants to perceive hues in a more interconnected and holistic manner.

Student Name: Araisrang Brahma Project Guide: Mohammed Naim Shaikh Project Brief: The project aims at designing a range of seating for different travel classes for Indian Railway coaches. Work continues on researching and finalizing various concepts and ideas that provide solutions to the problems faced during rail travels in India.

c) Bottle Holder for Sleeper Coach: Student Name: Pruthu Chitre Project Guide: Vikram Mitra Project Brief: Limited space on the tray makes it challenging to accommodate larger meals or multiple food items. Lack of stability in the tray design can lead to spills or items sliding off during train movements. Uneven surfaces or vibrations on trains can cause plates or cups to tip over, creating a mess. Insufficient space for condiments or additional accessories like napkins causes inconvenience during mealtimes. Difficulty in adjusting the tray angle or height to suit individual preferences leads to discomfort while eating.

Project Brief: By offering a wide range of highquality souvenirs that capture the essence of railway heritage, the project aims to enrich the cultural and historical significance of the museums and create a lasting impression on visitors. This research project seeks to focus on the complex interplay between souvenirs, gifting culture, museum identity, visitor interactions, and market dynamics within the context of Indian Railways museums. The findings and recommendations aim to contribute to the preservation of railway heritage, improved visitor experiences, and the development of sustainable souvenir solutions.

(2) Departmental Projects

a) Vande Bharat Colour Scheme

Project Brief: Use of minimal solid elements in the form of diagonally chamfered horizontal lines establishes a superfast and clean, modern look befitting of the train's technological prowess. The saffron colour from the Indian National Flag is used to depict the pride this train holds in establishing the indigeneity of its build.

b) Vande Bharat Logo Design

Project Brief: The stylized cheetah is symbolic of the train's advanced features, including but not limited to speed. The form is also inspired by a

train coming from a distance. The typeface has been selected to reflect the train's world-class standards and give the logo a premium look and feel.

c) One Station One Product

Project Brief: 'One Station One Product' scheme has been launched by Indian Railways with the objective to promote 'Vocal for Local' vision of the Government of India by providing a market for local/indigenous products and creating additional income opportunities for the marginalized sections of society.

Under the scheme, OSOP outlets at railway stations are allotted for showcasing, selling and giving high visibility to specific-to-the-place indigenous tribes' artefacts, local handlooms, handicrafts such as wood carving, chikankari, and zari-zardozi work, spices, tea, coffee and other processed/semi processed food items/products indigenously grown in that specific area.

A well-executed and effective display set up has been conceptualized by RDC and designed by IDS, that can help maximize commuter engagement and showing the benefits of each product, thus ensuring the products are seen by the commuters. A flat pack assembly design has been used for these stalls which makes transportation easy and installation quicker.

d) Establishment of Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Kendra (PMBJK) outlets at Railway stations:

Project Brief: In alignment with the 'Janaushadhi Scheme' launched by the Government of India, dedicated outlets known as 'Janaushadhi Kendras' have been opened to provide generic medicines at affordable prices.

PMBJK is the government-authorized organisation that offers several medical benefits to the

commuters which includes availability and dispensing of quality medicines, medicines for various ailments, guidance and assistance in terms of correct medicines, and superior quality and authenticity of medicines.

Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Kendra at Mehsana Railway Station is the pilot outlet of the same.

The RDC was nominated by the National Rail Museum (NRM) to conceptualize, design, and develop a series of souvenirs for all their 34 Rail Museums across India. The International Centre for Indian Crafts (ICIC) at NID is set up with the primary aim to effectively understand the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats of a particular crafts sector in its local context, apply NID's transdisciplinary design expertise and knowledge to bridge the gaps through a localglobal approach.

The centre's unique approach aims at developing a national and international network for crafts design research, training and knowledge dissemination for providing collaborative and sustainable linkages to the Indian crafts sector. Additionally, the centre focuses on creating opportunities for knowledge and skill exchange internationally as well as creating an interface between the government and the handicrafts sector for preparing policies to protect Intellectual Property in the Indian crafts sector.





INNOVATION CENTRE FOR NATURAL FIBRE (ICNF) Centre Head: Amit Sinha

The ICNF is an exploratory Research & Development Lab with innovation as its core objective. The centre has prioritised some natural fibres of national importance such as banana, bamboo, coir, hemp, jute, and Water Hyacinth for exploration. In this pursuit, it is networking with institutions within India and abroad to find appropriate and sustainable designs applications using these fibres as a primary material. The ICNF focuses on the vision to create an innovation-driven research culture in areas of sustainability, natural fibres, and materials with the support of state-of-the-art resources and efficient support services of NID, enabling ICNF researchers to explore cutting-edge local, national, and international research with respect for humanity, society, and environment.



SMART HANDLOOMS INNOVATION CENTRE (SHIC) Centre Head: V Sakthivel

To take handlooms to the future emerging paradigm for its cultural identity and sustainability and with an intent to integrate emerging technologies into creation of smart handlooms, the SHIC has been set up with the support of office of the Commissioner of Textiles, Development and Director of Handlooms and Textiles, Government of Karnataka for an initial duration of five years.



The purpose of the SHIC would be to integrate emerging technologies into creation of handloom textiles. With an aim for the seamless integration of tradition into the technological maker culture, this would lead to the creation of the next generation of weavers. It also aims to extend continuous design support to the textile sector in Karnataka.

SHIC is a resource collaborative which brings together weavers and professionals from diverse fields of design, research, technology, and marketing and aims to restore the dignity of handlooms to make handloom weaving a sustainable livelihood and vibrant craft in Karnataka.





9 NID PRESS


NID Press is an independent publications initiative of the National Institute of Design (NID), Ahmedabad NID Press covers a broad canvas of publications comprising books, conference proceedings, monographs, archival publications, anthologies, graphic novels, reprints, catalogues, and magazines to name a few. Each of these corrals design activities; pedagogic practices and theories; contemporary issues; social concerns; historical development; economic, political, and environmental contexts; global connections; and extrapolates the philosophical developments in design. With its renewed mandate, NID Press actively facilitates the commissioning of publications from its vast alumni group thereby bringing into the public domain, a mélange of deliberations on design. In recent times, several publications from NID Press have been platforms for students, faculty, staff, and alumni to articulate their academic and philosophical perspectives on design as praxis and design as a philosophy. Through its various publications, NID Press endeavours to turn the spotlight on various perspectives on design in both the local contexts and global scenarios.

During the year under review, NID Press organised the following events:

- On January 29, 2024, NID Press and Baatein organised a Book Talk and Book Signing event celebrating the book *Every Child Can* authored by NID alumnus Kiran Bir Sethi.
- In January 2024, NID Press organised a book release function for unveiling Learning Together at Jawaja, a book authored by former NID Director Ashoke Chatterjee and Harji Malik. The event saw the release of both the English and Hindi versions of this book.
- In October 2023, NID Press organised a talk with author, design historian, designer, and NID alumnus Sarita Sundar. The talk was titled 'This is not a Chair!' and it focused on Sundar's book

From the Frugal to the Ornate: Stories of the Seat in India.

- On October 25, 2023 NID Press organised a book talk on design history based on From the Frugal to the Ornate; Stories of the Seat in India authored by Sarita Sundar from the Godrej Archives
- An annual sale of all NID Press publications was held during the 43rd Convocation in January 2024.



The Centre for Teaching and Learning (CTL) recognises that there is a growing need for design educators in India. 'Research on Design Education' has been an underexplored area in India which provides the potential to initiate research, experiments, and innovation-led programmes for the future. This can support the need of improving the quality of educational experiences through the education and training of design educators across the country. It can be furthered by wide dissemination through training, workshops, and publications. The popularity of design education in India is growing rapidly thus intensifying this need for such a centre.

The aim of the CTL is to support, promote, and enhance effectiveness, inclusivity, and equity in learning experiences. It focuses on creating an institutional culture focused on learning by facilitating a space for sharing, discussing. and innovating the practices of design pedagogy. It facilitates three distinct verticals of 'Explore', 'Reflect-Share- Critique', and 'Connect'.

The following are the major activities undertaken by the CTL:

The CTL organised a session with **Prof. Juan Cruz**, Principal of the Edinburgh College of Art (ECA), University of Edinburgh on October 06, 2023 at the NID Ahmedabad campus Several faculty members attended the session, especially the junior faculty. He explained the research pedagogy at ECA. This was followed by interesting discussions on a practicebased approach to design research.

The CTL organised a preparatory plan with Mihir Bhatt and his team from Shanti Sadan, Ahmedabad at NID on October 25, 2023. This preparatory plan meeting was organised to discuss the modalities for a wider seminar discussing pedagogies developed around colour on 7th & 8th February 2024. This meeting was led by Marianne Keller Tschirren (Dr.), Head of Archives/ Library/Research, Zentrum Paul Klee. The approach towards colour pedagogy at NID was introduced by Gayatri Menon (Dr.) after which, she invited the faculty team from the Design Foundation Studies Programme to share its experiences on the ongoing elective on colour.

In the session, the Design Foundation Studies Programme faculty team was represented by **Andrea Noronha, Vijaya Barge,** and **Sneha Mundari** who shared the outcome of the ongoing elective on colour. Senior faculty members and visiting faculty members who teach courses on colour attended the meeting and discussed colour pedagogy in detail. **Nijoo Dubey** from the NID Bengaluru campus also joined the session.





There was a talk on 'Efficacious Intimacy: A Framework to Study Embodied Material Practices' on February 16, 2024 by **Urmila Mohan (Dr.)**, an anthropologist who focuses on material culture comprising cloth, clothing, and bodily practices. She is an Honorary Research Fellow, Dept. Of Anthropology, University College London and the founder/editor of the open-access digital journal The Jugaad Project for the study of embodiment and materiality. Considering the two critical aspects of her work; namely, material culture as well as research methodology, **Gayatri Menon (Dr.)** had also invited doctoral students from NID who were undergoing a course on Research Methods to attend the session.

This talk explored Mohan's concept of 'efficacious intimacy' as an embodied, anthropological framework of worldmaking and discusses chapters by colleagues on art, craft, and design within belief practices. It shares themes from the volume edited by Mohan; namely, The Efficacy of Intimacy and Belief in Worldmaking Practices (Routledge, 2024) where scholars and creatives approached their research through the lenses of intimacy and efficacy. Taking an innovative approach to the topic of worldmaking as the co-making of subjects and objects and situated in a larger philosophy of motion and incompleteness, it offers an examination of how life-worlds are constructed by and can be studied via embodiment and material culture theories.

The CTL organised a session with

Prof. David Grossman Co-Director of the TASA-ICoD International Design Education Laboratory and former President of ICoD. He has significantly influenced the discourse on global design education and advocacy for faculty members in a hybrid mode. Faculty members from NID Bengaluru and NID Gandhinagar campuses joined the session which was held on March 15, 2024. The invitation was also extended to visiting faculty members.










The CTL also arranged an interaction with **Prof. Vijay Kumar**, an alumnus of NID (Product Design,) and author of the book101 Design Methods: A Structured Approach for Driving Innovation in Your Organisation. This book is widely referenced globally.

Prof. Kumar's session on structured methodologies, tools, and frameworks for human-centred innovations spans diverse domains including education, healthcare, communication, retail, social reform, and emerging markets. Around 20–25 faculty members participated in person as well as through online mode. It was noteworthy to know his thoughts on the methodological grounding of design practice and how his design education at NID formed the foundation of his illustrious professional career. Experiences of embedding research in design institutes and creating a nurturing environment for research were found to be very interesting and useful.







11 INTEGRATED DESIGN SERVICES (IDS)

Client servicing is an integral part of NID's activities. Through the Integrated Design Services (IDS) department, NID undertakes consultancy projects from various government, semi-government, and private organisations. It professionally delivers design solutions in diverse design domains ranging from Industrial Design, Communication Design, Textile/ Apparel/Lifestyle Accessory Design, and IT Integrated Design.

The IDS also has its Outreach Activities to provide the institute's experience and training facilities to the services of craft sectors in the areas of training, research and need assessment study, craft documentation, capacity building, and skill upgradation in design using contextual approach.

Through its 'Earn While You Learn Scheme', the IDS also facilitates students' participation in real-world projects, which in turn, adds value to the upcoming professionals giving them an understanding of actual situations.

13 STRATEGY & PLANNING

Over the last two decades, NID Ahmedabad has significantly expanded its educational programmes and student intake, built two new campuses, and considerably expanded its activities beyond education. With the institute acquiring the status of 'Institute of National Importance' (INI) in 2014, it is imperative to consolidate its activities, realign the institute with respect to other Institutes of National Importance, examine its existing status, and develop a strategic plan for the future which will enable NID to grow systematically. This activity is organised under the umbrella of the Strategy & Planning (S&P) department.

The main functions of the department include:

 Prepare strategic plans aimed at rationalisation, prioritisation, and diversification of institutional activities, human resources, infrastructure, and funds.

- Preparation of major developmental proposals and providing inputs to respective departments.
- Strategic planning of major procurements.
- Collate financial data for budgetary estimates and prepare rational plans for prioritisation and optimal allocation of funds.
- Develop proposals for endowments, its investments, and monitor existing allocations and their utilisation.
- Planning expansion of campus infrastructure, resources for implementation of EWS, new research infrastructure, and providing plans and estimates to the Infrastructure Strategy Committee.
- Provide policy related inputs on all the above matters to the institute's Senate, Standing Committee, and Governing Council.

In order to ensure adequate promotion and development of Official Language (OL) Hindi as per the Official Language Policy of the Government, the institute organised various activities and programmes as part of its Annual Programme for 2023–2024. In order to comply with the directions issued by the Ministry of Commerce and Industry regarding the implementation/compliance of the Official Language Policy of the Government and to achieve the target set by the Department of Official Language, renewed focus was laid on the programmes that should be maintained throughout the plan period and not only at its beginning. The report also highlighted the importance of inter-departmental coordination in implementing the Official Language Scheme.

The Official Language Coordination Unit is entrusted with the task of coordinating the departmental action plans and providing necessary support for identifying and achieving the strategy by the departments. The institute has prepared its own action plan for implementing the various provisions contained therein. The mandate of the Official Language Section is therefore to ensure continued progress as the scheme is to be launched and implemented in the coming years. The use of Hindi ministry-wise/sectorwise is assessed on the basis of review of compliance of Section 3(3) of the Official Languages Act, 1963 and Rule 5 of the Official Languages Rules, 1976 relating to: correspondence in Hindi, publications in Hindi, code-manuals and training, purchase of Hindi books in Central Government offices, computerisation and Hindi, compulsory provision of knowledge of Hindi in recruitment rules, availability of Hindi medium in educational and training institutions, expenditure on Hindi advertisements, and the use of Hindi for business activities.

As a first step in this regard, most of the correspondence with Central and State Government organisations was conducted in Hindi. Apart from carrying out regular official work at the institute in Hindi, the following activities were organised. with great motivation and encouragement.

Organisation of Bhasha Utsav 2023

NID is continuously making efforts to promote the Hindi language. The 'Bhasha Utsav' was organised by the Hindi Section in September–October 2023 in order to accelerate the use of Hindi as the official language and to create awareness as well as to establish unity among various Indian languages this year. As part of the Bhasha Utsav, various competitions were organised for students, faculty members, and staff across NID's Ahmedabad, Gandhinagar, and Bengaluru campuses this year. These included competitions such as poetry writing, poster design, singing, Hindi slogan writing, Hindi drama, antakshari, story reading, Hindi debate and several others. The event was promoted in the institute through posters, banners, T-shirts, post cards, badges, and stickers.

Apart from this, a two-day theatre workshop was also organised for the students of the institute under the leadership of Shilpi Marwah, director of Sukhmanch Theatre. As a part of this workshop, students were introduced to the nuances of theatre. While students give shape to their thoughts through design, theatre taught them the art of expressing their thoughts through acting. During the Bhasha Utsav, Sukhmanch Theatre also staged the dramatisation of Amrita Pritam's stories. Its purpose was to attract students towards Hindi literature along with Hindi language because literature expands the scope of any language. At the end of each competition in Bhasha Utsav, the winning participants were honoured with cash prizes and certificates. Bhasha Utsav not only promoted Hindi and other Indian languages in the institute but it also created a literary environment within the campus. This festival definitely helped in the all-round development of the students.

Publications in Hindi

Several Hindi language publications brought out by the institute in 2023–2024. The Hindi version of the institute's Annual Report 2022–2023 was published. Official Language manuals, calendars, films, and posters were brought out in order to give information about the activities related to the dissemination and progressive use of Hindi as the official language. The Hindi magazine Rupankan is Hindi language writings on design, literature, technology, information technology and others with the aim of widely publicising the efforts being made in various offices under the Central Government towards the promotion of the Hindi language. Its eighth issue was published during the year and it included articles by students, staff, and faculty members of the institute. Some articles contributed by guest writers were also included in the magazine. Along with this, poems and stories were also published. The admission booklet of the institute, various tenders, and advertisements were also published in Hindi as far as possible. The Hindi translation of Leading Lights on Design was also published. Efforts were made as far as possible to publish Hindi translations of various useful articles.

Official Language Implementation Committee

- Important discussions were held with the concerned parties on the progress of implementation of the official language in the meeting. There was a positive discussion on the promotion and implementation of the official language in the meeting.
- For the review of the half-yearly progress report related to the progressive use of Hindi (from April 01, 2023 to September 30, 2023), the National Institute of Design had submitted its half-yearly report on time.

- In the meeting, the winners of the competitions organized by TOLIC during the last half-year were awarded. Also, all the institutions were expected to organise competitions for the promotion of Hindi and encourage people from various institutions to participate.
- The Parliamentary Official Language Committee inspected the institute. The committee's report on the progress of official language during the inspection was satisfactory.

Achievements of the Hindi Department

Rupankan magazine focuses on highlighting and focussing on promoting Hindi stories, Hindi poems, and Rajbhasha Hindi related activities in the institution. The current publishing edition is 4th has been edited by Dinesh Kumar Prasad (Dr.)This edition is a special tribute to the design guru H. Kumar Vyas for his contribution to the field of design. It shows the assimilative trend of the department where Hindi is helping technical subjects such as design to enrich its social appeal. This magazine will be released during the convocation.

The department is leading ahead in translation work too. The Hindi translation of Leading Lights on Design is set to be released. It is an anthology of convocation addresses delivered at the institute.

Also in the pipeline is NID Ek Parichay, a book written by Dinesh Kumar Prasad (Dr.). It is an introduction of NID and its role in integrating various disciplines and departments. The next is the publication of the Design Dictionary. It is unique as it consists of around 20000 words from 20 design disciplines. It will further pave the way for doing research on such initiatives.

Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF DESIGN, AHMEDABAD ("the Institution"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2024 and the Income and Expenditure Account for the year ended on that date, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "the financial statements").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion section of our report, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the National Institute of Design Act, 2014 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) read with the National Institute of Design (Form of Annual Statement of Accounts) Rules, 2016 and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Institute as at March 31, 2024 and its surplus for the year ended on that date.

Basis for qualified opinion

- a. Balances of Rs. 2069.61 lakhs under the head Projects Advances for Projects in Progress are subject to confirmation and effect on these balances on account of adjustment, if any, required upon such confirmation are not determinable.
- b. Balances of Rs. 356.95 lakhs under the head Projects receivables and service charges receivables outstanding for more than one year are subject to confirmation and effect on these balances on account of adjustment, if any, required upon such confirmation are not determinable.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Standards on Auditing (SAs) issued by the ICAI. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Institute in accordance with Code of Ethics issued by the ICAI. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified opinion.

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Annual Accounts of National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad for the year ended 31st March 2024.

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad as on 31 March, 2024 and the Income & Expenditure Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19(2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 25(2) of the National Institute of Design (NID) Act, 2014. These financial statements are the responsibility of the NID's Management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial statements with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Report/CAG's Audit Reports separately.

3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by the management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

- 4. Based on our audit, we report that:
 - i. We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
- ii. The Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format approved by the Government under sub-rule (1) of rule 4 of National Institute of Design (Form of Annual Accounts) Rules, 2016.
- iii. In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the NID as required under Section 25 (1) of the National Institute of Design Act, 2014 in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.
- iv. We further report that:

- A. Comments on Accounts
- 1. Balance Sheet

1.1 Capital Fund and Liabilities Earmarked and Endowment Funds (Schedule 2) Corpus fund from Govt. for India Design Council: ₹5.18 crore

This does not include interest liability of ₹31.80 lakh towards Govt. of India due to nonabiding the terms and conditions of Grant Sanction letter.

NID submitted a proposal of ₹7.50 crore for the year 2017-18, 2018-19 & 2019-20 for Promotion Design in educational institutes and industry as well as for initiatives viz. Promotion of India Design Mark, Promoting Indian Design Abroad, International Competition & New Designer Exhibition, National Aptitude Test for Design India Design Center, against which Govt sanctioned/released ₹2.50 crore in March 2019. Due to non-utilization of grant of ₹2.50 crore which was released as 1st installation for promotional activities against total grant of ₹7.50 crore for 3 years, NID, Ahmedabad received notice from DPIIT, GoI in November 2020 regarding surrender of unspent amount along with interest or submit utilization certificate.

The grant sanction order for ₹2.50 crore stipulates that, "if the grantee fails to utilize the grant for purpose for which the same has been sanctioned or does not adhere to the terms & conditions of grant and GFR provisions, the grantee Institution shall be required to refund the grant with interest @10% per annum". Since Grant was sanctioned/released in March 2019 and even after lapse of 20 months from the date of release of grant, management could not utilize the grant and consequently management was asked for refund of grant with interest. In compliance to the DPIIT order, grant was refunded in December 2020. The total liability of the Institute comes to ₹41.66 lakh (*interest @10% for 20 months on ₹2.50 crore*). Out of ₹41.66 lakh, Institute had only refunded ₹9.86 lakh interest earned on the grant and balance ₹31.80 lakh was outstanding for making refund to DPIIT.

This issue was also included in Separate Audit Report for FY 2022-23; however, management had not created liability of ₹31.80 lakh in the books of account. Thus, non-providing liability has resulted in understatement of Liability & expenses and overstatement of Surplus by ₹31.80 lakh in the Books of Accounts for FY 2023-24.

1.2 Current Liabilities: ₹48.72 crore (Schedule-5)

This does not include demand of Ministry of MSME of ₹8.58 crore plus interest on account of Design Clinic Scheme Closure.

Design Clinic Scheme was launched in February 2010 by MSME (Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium enterprise) with NID as the nodal implementing agency. The Scheme was taken in Phases.

During Phase-I, MSME released ₹28.57 crore against which NID reported expenditure of ₹27.11 crore. However, MSME calculated ₹22.47 crore including NID administrative

fees as total expenditure made by NID under Phase-I of DCS upto 31.03.2016 and levied total recovery of ₹4.82 crore with interest @10% thereon.

During Phase-II, NID was sanctioned ₹8.00 crore but was disbursed only ₹6.72 crore (after adjustment of excess expenditure of ₹1.28 crore pertains to Phase-I). Out of ₹6.72 crore, NID made expenditure to the tune of ₹3.70 crore for Professional Design Projects which was restricted by MSME as ₹3.57 crore. Further NID reported ₹4.29 crore as administrative fees which was restricted by MSME as ₹53.62 lakh. Ministry of MSME asked NID to refund ₹8.58 crore (₹4.82 crore for Phase-I and ₹3.76 crore for Phase-II) with 10 *per cent* interest.

Management has not created liability against demand raised by the MSME for the FY 2023-24, which resulted in understatement of liability & expenses to the tune of ₹8.58 crore plus interest of ₹3.66 crore¹ till 31.03.2024 and overstatement of Surplus to the same extent.

This issue was also included in Separate Audit Report for FY 2021-22 & FY 2022-23. However, Management has neither provided the liability/appropriate disclosure through Notes to Accounts in the books of Accounts nor pursued the matter with the Ministry for waiver of demand till date.

B. Grants-in-aid

Grants and Contributions (Schedule 3): ₹14.98 crore

Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Department for Promotion of Industry & Internal Trade releases Grant for Plan Recurring and Non-recurring programme, Machinery, Equipment, Books etc. every year. As per the Grant release letter of Ministry, article 2 (XVII) stated that any unspent balance of the Grant should be refunded to the Govt. of India before the close of the Financial Year. As on 01.04.2023, NID had unspent balance of Grant of ₹13.47 crore pertaining to previous years. The Government of India had given Grant of ₹61.52 crore (including Interest on Grant Rs. 0.60 crore) to NID during 2023-24. Out of the total grant of ₹74.99 crore, NID had utilized ₹59.44 crore and refunded ₹0.57 crore to Govt. of India during FY 2023-24 leaving a balance of ₹14.98 crore unutilized as on 31st March 2024.

C. Management Letter

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Separate Audit Report would be brought to the notice of the Management, through a Management Letter issued separately for remedial/corrective actions.

v. Subject to our observation in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.

- vi. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to matters mentioned in the Annexure-I to this Separate Audit Report, give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India, except the following:
 - a) in so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the National Institute of Design, Ahmedabad as at 31 March 2024; and
 - b) in so far as it relates to Income & Expenditure Account, of the excess of income over expenditure for the year ended on that date.

NOTES FORMING PART OF ACCOUNTS

1 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

a. ACCOUNTING CONVENTION:

The Financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention, unless otherwise stated and on the accrual method of accounting except for interest income, fees and liability towards privileged leave.

b. INVESTMENTS:

Long Term Investments are stated at cost.

c. FIXED ASSETS:

Fixed Assets are stated at the cost. The cost includes invoice value, freight, octroi, and other incidental expenses relating acquisition.

d. GOVERNMENT GRANTS:

- Government grants are accounted on the basis of sanction from Government Department.
- ii Government grant to the extent utilized towards capital expenditure, are transferred to the Capital Fund.
- iii Government grants for meeting Revenue expenditure are treated as income of the year to the extent of expenditure incurred.
- iv Unutilized grants are carried forward and exhibited as a Liability in the Balance Sheet
- The excess recurring expenditure incurred against recurring grant is met from NID's own source of funds.

e. DEPRECIATION:

- Depreciation on addition has been provided for the full year irrespective of date of acquisition.
- iii Capital Fund account has been transferred to Income and Expenditure account to the extent of depreciation provided on assets acquired out of capital grant.
- iv Depreciation is not provided on assets sold during the year.

f. FOREIGN CURRENCY TRANSACTION:

Transaction denominated in foreign currency are accounted for at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of transaction. The bank balance held in foreign currency is converted in to Rupee at the rate prevailing on the closing day of the financial year.

g. CURRENT ASSETS, LOANS AND ADVANCES:

In the opinion of the Management, the current assets, loans and advances have a value on realisation in the ordinary course of business, equal at least to the aggregate amount shown in the Balance Sheet.

h. RETIREMENT/TERMINAL BENEFIT

Terminal leave encashment benefit to the employees is accounted for on cash basis. The institute has created Employee's Leave Encashment Earmarked Fund. The amount paid for leave encashment at the time of superannuation, voluntary retirement etc has been charged to the said fund.

Gratuity is charged to Income & Expenditure A/c on the basis of Actuarial valuation and the same is contributed to the NID Employees' Gratuity Fund.

i. UNCLAIMED STUDENT DEPOSIT

The unclaimed student deposit lying for more than 10 years amounting to Rs. 2,30,000/has been credited to Donation for Financial Aid to Students.

- Expenditure in excess of recurring grant amounting to Rs. 4,49,02,980/- for other administrative expenditure has been met from Institute's Own Sources of Funds.

- 4. Estimated amount of contract remaining to be executed on capital account and not provided is approximately Rs. 0.71 crore (Previous Year Rs. 1.53 crore) for Vertical Expansion & Allied works for Girls Hostel at Paldi Campus, Rs. 2.29 crore approximately (Previous Year Rs. 2.29 crore) for strengthening of Incubation and Innovation Centre at Bengaluru Campus and Rs. 0.76 crore approximately (Previous Year Rs. 3.24 crore) for Strengthening of Incubation and Innovation center at Gandhinagar Campus.
- 5. Department for Promotion of Industry & Internal Trade, Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Government of India has established new NIDs at various places viz. Johrat, Hyderabad, Bhopal, Kurukshetra, Vijayawada etc. The activities of these NIDs falls outside the preview of Governing Council of NID Ahmedabad. As per the grant sanctioned letter received from Department of Industrial Policy & Promotion, Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Govt. of India, the grant (revenue and capital) of NID Kurukshetra, Vijayawada, Bhopal & Jorhat has been routed through NID, Ahmedabad and the expenditure incurred for the said institutes have been charged against the grant.
- Campuses at Gandhinagar and Bengaluru have been constructed on 15 acres and 2 acres of land provided on lease by the Government of Gujarat and DPIIT, Government of India through CMTI respectively.
- The Income of the Institute is exempt under the Income Tax Act 1961. No provision for income tax is therefore made in the accounts.
- The Institute's Income and Expenditure Account, Balance Sheet and the Schedules are prepared as per the National Institute of Design (Form of Annual Statement of Accounts) Rules, 2016.
- Corresponding figures for the previous year have been regrouped/rearranged where ever necessary.
- 10. Figures in the Final accounts have been rounded off to the nearest rupee.





The NDBI was set up at NID Ahmedabad with the support of the Department of Science & Technology (DST), Government of India and Department for Promotion of Industry & Internal Trade (DPIIT), Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Government of India. The NDBI is also one of the Nodal Institutes for Industries Commissionerate, Government of Gujarat for promoting the state's start-up policies.

Key NDBI Initiatives Accomplished 2023–2024 MoU's/Partnerships & Tie-ups:

ANNEXURE 2

INDIA DESIGN COUNCIL (IDC)

This is an autonomous body of the Government of India established under the aegis of the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, Ministry of Commerce & Industry. It is a national strategic body for multidisciplinary design and is involved in the promotion of design to ultimately make India a design enabled country. In 2007, India became one of the few countries to adopt a National Design Policy. To enable the policy implementation, the Indian Government announced establishment of the Indian Design Council (IDC) in March 2009.

The India Design Council is spearheading the national design direction and is working with other government agencies, the design community, industry, and educational institutions to promote design in business, society, and public services and further, in developing design excellence.

The **India Design Mark** is a design standard, a symbol, which recognises good design. The India Design Council grants the India Design Mark after evaluating good design through a systemised process. It is initiated in cooperation with the Good Design Award, Japan. The India Design Mark symbolises product excellence in form, function, quality, safety, sustainability and innovation and communicates that the product is usable, durable, aesthetically appealing, and socially responsible.

The third council formed on May 08, 2017 has completed its three year term on May 07, 2020. We await the reconstitution of the Governing Council of IDC by the Ministry in order to form the fourth council.
